3.15	<p>Born in Chapel Allerton Nursing Home. Now live on Davies Avenue, on Green View Court. Lived in Oakwood Ave and then in Springwood Rd previously. Went to Roundhay St John Primary School when it was tiny. Buildings were a T shape. Teacher Mrs Hill and Headteacher Gilbert Webster. Headteacher taught them all in the afternoon. Wrote with dipping pens. 13 or 14 in class. 6 of them passed 11 plus. Went home for dinner. Got bus on her own. Crossed Wetherby Rd on her own. One day at the bottom of Wellington Hill a tanker had crashed, spilling liquid down the road. She was late back to school after dinner.</p>
5.15	<p>A lovely little school. No facilities. Mrs Hill was a tartar. Had spelling test – can remember having to spell wheat. Sprained her ankle once so she didn't have to go out to play. Once had a week off because her mother was in hospital.</p>
8.30	<p>Roundhay High School – a culture shock. Used fountain pens – was humiliated by teacher Miss Peat because she was told off for standard of handwriting in her book. Prefabs in playground for 6th form. Left school in 1966. Did A levels in Common Room. Still wore hats until the 6th form. Had to wear uniform even in 6th form. Couldn't leave school during the day. All the teachers looked old.</p>
