	<p>Operational Officer for Leeds City Council. Born in Harehills. Used to leave Harehills School and deliver papers around Gipton Wood area. Remembers what is now Roundhay Pub. Remembers trams. Fond memories of the clock. Met young ladies there. Trams ran parallel up Princes Ave to entrance of Roundhay Park where there was a terminus. Watched conductor unhook the line and push all the seats to face the opposite way.</p> <p>Played rugby – one day he came up to Oakwood to be confronted by a police cordon. Had been a murder at the back of the changing area who turned out to be one of the victims of the Yorkshire Ripper.</p> <p>Clock area used by lots of children as a congregation point. Injured servicemen used to meet there and also in the past people who were out of work met there.</p> <p>It will be a long term tourist attraction and will bring lots of people into Oakwood area.</p>
